Kohler Co. Executive Chairman Herbert Vollrath Kohler, Jr.

It is with sadness we report Mr. Kohler passed away on September 3, 2022, in Kohler, Wisconsin. He was 83.

A tribute for Mr. Kohler stated he was educated at the Kohler schools in Kohler, Wis., and at Choate Rosemary Hall in Wallingford, Conn. As a young man, he spent many summers working on the Kohler farms and in most of the manufacturing divisions of Kohler Co. After serving with the U.S. Army Reserve, studying at the University of Zurich in Switzerland, and launching a brief acting career at Knox College in Illinois, he completed his education at Yale University, graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree in industrial administration in 1965.

He rejoined Kohler Co. full-time as an R&D technician shortly after graduation. He became a Director of the company in 1967, and when his father died a year later, he became Vice President of Operations. He was named Executive Vice President in 1971, was elected Chairman of the Board and CEO in 1972, and President of the Company in 1974 – at the age of 35. In 2015, he became the company's Executive Chairman, with son David taking the helm as President and CEO. He served Kohler Co. for 61 years.

Is a provider in network?

If you have vision coverage through Kohler, the coverage is through VSP. VSP does not send you a vision card; you do not need a vision card when you see an in-network provider. However, if you would like a vision card you may print one off at vsp.com. I encourage you to contact VSP at 800-877-7195 to assure the provider is in-network because in-network providers do leave VSP. No notice is given when this happens, the only way to know for sure is to contact VSP before you go to your vision appointment.

The same is true for medical coverage. Aurora and Prevea are in-network, that doesn't necessarily mean the provider you see at Aurora or Prevea is in-network. You would need to call United Healthcare (UHC) 800-996-6734 or online myuhc.com to verify the provider is in network. You may also print an UHC medical card online. Prior approval is needed by UHC for certain procedures. I encourage you before having procedures completed to contact UHC or your provider to verify prior approval has been completed.

Are you enrolled in the dental through Kohler? You would need to contact Delta Dental 800-236-3712 or deltadentalwi.com to verify your provider is in-network.

is one of the largest and most diverse unions in North America, with members in virtually every sector of the economy.

UAW represented workplaces range from multinational corporations, small manufacturers, and state and local governments to colleges and universities, hospitals and private non-profit organizations.

The UAW has more than 400,000 active members and more than 580,000 retired members in the United States, Canada, and Puerto Rico.

There are more than 600 local unions in the UAW. The UAW currently has 1,150 contracts with some 1,600 employers in the United States, Canada, and Puerto Rico.

A unique strength of the UAW is the solidarity between its active and retired members. A solid majority of the union's retirees stay actively involved in the life of their union, participating in retiree chapters and playing a vital role in the UAW's community action program.

Since its founding in 1935, the UAW has consistently developed innovative partnerships with employers and negotiated industry-leading wages and benefits for its members.

United Auto Workers-Case New Holland strike

United Auto Workers in Burlington, Iowa, and Racine, Wisconsin remain on strike since May 2. The Union is asking Case New Holland for better pay, healthcare and working conditions.

It appears both sides are holding to their positions, with the UAW firmly supporting workers via strike pay and health insurance.
